Safe operation of ambulances and response vehicles as stipulated by EMS department policies and ND laws & regulations. JOB SUMMARY: Discharge Clerk/Receptionist is responsible for handling all telephone communications, interacting with the general public, medical staff as well as other hospital staff and the completion of all requests for medical records. In addition, is responsible for assembly, scanning and analysis of all discharged records, generating computer reports, filing, purging and a variety of miscellaneous duties within the department.
